Named the “**1997 Shawnee High School Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year,**” Lindsey Gehris Fleischhauer was one of those athletes who participated in many sports throughout her years at Shawnee, including Swimming and Winter Track, but ultimately excelling in Field Hockey in the position of Wing and Lacrosse as Low Defense. Lindsey earned a total of nine varsity letters among four sports during her high school career.

Lindsey performed on the Lacrosse field as Low Defense, and earned the accolades of All County, All State, **Player of The Year**, and All American. Lindsey helped the Girls Lacrosse team reach Sectional and State Championships in 1996 and an undefeated 1997. Lindsey was 1st Team All-State in 1997, 1st Team All-South Jersey in 1996 and 1997, and 1st Team All-Conference 1996 and 1997. Also in 1997, Lindsey was named the **Lacrosse Defensive Player of the Year** at the time when the Shawnee Lacrosse Team was ranking 6th nationally by Lacrosse Magazine.

Lindsey’s equally impressive performance in Field Hockey in the position of Wing saw her claim titles in All County, All State, All Decade team and All-American, while also seeing a Field Hockey South Jersey Group IV Title in 1994 and State Championship in 1995. Lindsey was named 1st Team All-State in 1995 and 1996, 1st Team All-South Jersey in 1995 and 1996, and 1st Team All-Group IV in 1995, 1996 and 1996.

Lindsey also participated in the USFHA Elite Futures Program, selected to “B” camp, named the **1995 Garden State Summer Games MVP Offensive Player** and was recipient of the **Governor’s Cup Award**. In 1995, Lindsey was named the USFHA All-American “Player to Watch” and in 1996 named the **USFHA High School All-American**.



Lindsey attended Penn State University, graduating in 2001 with her Bachelor’s Degree in Sociology. Lindsey continued her Field Hockey career at the collegiate level, playing positions of Defense and Midfield. She helped lead her team as one of the Big Ten Champions in Field Hockey, receiving multiple Top 10 Division 1 rankings. Academically, Lindsey also excelled, making the Dean’s list at Penn State in both 2000 and 2001.

During 1993-1996, Lindsey coached with the MYAA Medford Youth Field Hockey program and served on the Medford Township Athletic Advisory Board 1996-1997. Lindsey works in Research Administration for Duke University as a Grants and Contracts Administrator. Lindsey currently lives in Rock Hill, South Carolina with her children Jackson, Nickolas, Ellie and Wyatt.
