# How to cite the pictures from the Internet

---

1. Go to Citation Machine: <http://www.citationmachine.net/> or <http://www.easybib.com/>
2. Select MLA
3. The default MLA format is MLA7. We will be using MLA8. Be sure to select this before you begin.
4. Choose what it is that you would like to cite. For this project, click other and then click Digital Image.
5. What do you need to include:

Click on Visit Page in Google Images to see these requirements:

- *Photographer if known* – look for the caption to the picture.
- *Title of picture*– look to see if the picture you are using has a caption. This is usually where the title will be if there is one.

*or*

- *Description* - You will create this. Be as specific as possible.
- *Website title* - What website are you on.

Click on View Image in Google Images to see this requirements:

- *URL* - This URL should end in the image extension (.jpg, .png, .gif) etc.
- To find this, click on View Image in Google Images. Copy and paste the URL from this
