- Use the following for weather vocabulary: flashcards and crossword puzzles. (A)
- Complete textbook written and listening exercises and activities on vocabulary and grammar. (A, M)
- Complete workbook written and listening exercises and activities on vocabulary and grammar. (A, M)
- Complete teacher made worksheets on vocabulary (weather, months, and seasons) and grammar (the prepositional and instrumental cases). (A)
- Repeat vocabulary for weather terminology after the teacher and after native speakers on CDs. (A)
- Memorize the verb conjugations of «идти» in the past, present, and future tenses for weather expressions. (A)
- Memorize dative case subject-less constructions to convey feelings. (A)
- Identify and discuss different kinds of weather. (A, M)
- Translate vocabulary terms from Russian to English and from English to Russian. (A)
- Play a class game such as vocabulary Bingo, "Hands Up", or Jeopardy. (A)
- Complete cultural readings and related activities in the textbook and workbook. (M)
- View appropriate DVDs, (in Russian and English), YouTube videos (in Russian) and complete related activities. (M)
- Explore appropriate Russian websites on weather and fill out a graphic organizer. (M)
- Use the dative case and the preposition "k" to indicate going to someone's place or going to see someone. (M)
- Read or listen to Russian weather forecasts on line. (M)
- Use websites such as www.quizlet.com or www.masterrussian.com to reinforce vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, and conversational skills. (M)
- Interview a classmate to determine things s/he will do during different weather and report your findings to the class using if/then constructions. (T)
- Listen to a native speaker talk about the weather and summarize in Russian what is said, orally or in writing. (T)
- Write an email in Russian accepting a friend's invitation to visit and asking which items to bring based on the weather. (T)
- Read an authentic weather report and create a mini-dialogue discussing what to do that day. (T)
- Text a friend in Russian indicating a plan to visit based on the weather. (T)
- Telephone a Russian friend, invite him/her for a visit, and suggest activities to do. (T)
